Markups for "Small Tools & Consumables" (4%) and "Insurance" (4.5%) are incorporated into the Washington University Labor Rates. These markups are based on a percentage of the straight-time base wage; and they are added to all straight-time, time and one-half, and double-time rates.

In support of the Washington University's "In St. Louis, For St. Louis" commitment, contractors will be allowed to charge journeyman rates for apprentices working on university jobs that are subject to this wage schedule. This provision is being made to incentivize the use of apprentices on Washington University jobs and strengthen the labor market in the local construction industry.
